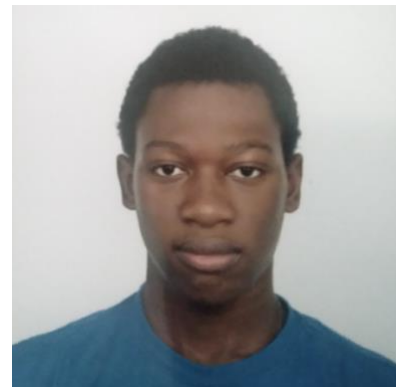


Re: 2022-2023 Vincent and Sylvia Thompson Scholarship Recipient – Matthew Savage, Grade 12

Dear Ms. ██████████:

Congratulations! Calabar Alumni Florida is pleased to announce that your son, Matthew Savage, is the recipient of the 2nd annual Vincent & Sylvia Thompson Scholarship for the school year 2022-2023. The scholarship committee (copied below) convened and selected Matthew to receive this financial assistance.

The scholarship application signed by you and Matthew acknowledges your understanding of the [specific requirements](#); Matthew must follow to remain eligible to keep receiving the scholarship benefits **after** this initial term. He must:



1. Maintain academic solid standing or progress.
2. Maintain a 95% attendance record.
3. Be free of any disciplinary issues.
4. Participate in school co-curricular life by being in a school-sanctioned club or being a member of a school sports team; and

5. At the end of every school term, email the scholarship committee (scholarship@scbarfla.org) to update them on his grades, school activities and general school life.

The scholarship provides funding for the following, **effective November 1, 2022**, and shall be disbursed by the school's Bursar:

- a. A one-time \$7,500 contribution for purchasing two sets of school uniforms;
- b. \$200 for bus fare to and from school for five days per week;
- c. \$600 for school lunch five days per week; and
- d. \$14,800 towards school or exam fees (this amount roughly equates to 35 days of school lunch and bus fare for school days already passed)

At the end of the school year, should Matthew achieve an overall grade average of B+ or better, he will be eligible to receive US\$300 towards purchasing a laptop computer.

We hope your son continues to do well in school and takes advantage of every opportunity to improve and excel in his studies and school activities at Calabar. I know you believe in him, and so do we. Therefore, we are only happy to support Calabar in molding young boys into the responsible men of tomorrow.

We appreciate Calabar Florida Alumni members Karl Thompson, '80 and his brother Maurice Thompson, '82, for continuing to fund this scholarship for the second consecutive year in memory of their parents.
