Dear Ms. Davis:  
Congratulations! We are pleased to inform you that your son Justin Francis is the second recipient of the Third Annual Vincent & Sylvia Thompson Scholarship for the school year 2023-2024. It is unprecedented that we can fund **two scholarships in one year** for this particular scholarship. This reason is due to the gracious contributions of Calabar Florida Alumni Andre Bryan '83 and Carlton Daley '80, along with matching assistance from the Thompsons. Consequently, we are happy to withdraw our earlier letter advising that we could not offer Justin a scholarship.



The scholarship application signed by you and Justin acknowledges your understanding of the [strict scholarship requirements](#) that Justin **shall follow** to remain eligible to receive the scholarship benefits **after** this initial term. He shall:

1. Maintain academic solid standing or progress.
2. Maintain a 95% attendance record.
3. Be free of any disciplinary issues.
4. Participate in school co-curricular life by being in a school-sanctioned club or being a member of a school sports team; and

5. At the end of every school term, email the scholarship committee ([scholarship@scbarfla.org](mailto:scholarship@scbarfla.org)) to update them on his grades, school activities and general school life.

The scholarship provides funding of approximately JM\$150,000 (until depleted) for the following, **effective October 30, 2023**, and shall be disbursed through the school's Bursar:

1. \$750 per day for bus fare to and from school for five days per week and
2. \$600 for school lunch five days per week,

At the end of the school year, should Justin achieve an overall grade average of B+ or better, he will be eligible to receive US\$300 towards purchasing a laptop computer.

We hope your son continues to do well in school and takes advantage of every opportunity to improve and excel in his studies and school activities at Calabar. I know you believe in him, and so do we. Therefore, we are only happy to support Calabar in molding young boys into the responsible men of tomorrow.

We appreciate Calabar Florida Alumni members Karl Thompson, '80 and Maurice Thompson, '82, (as well as the co-contributors mentioned above) for continuing to fund this scholarship in memory of Vincent and Sylvia Thompson.
